Summary

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Summary

The National Citizen Survey[™] (The NCS) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. This report discusses differences in opinion of survey respondents by length of residency in McAllen, annual household income, age of respondent and gender of respondent.

Responses in the following tables show only the proportion of respondents giving a certain answer; for example, the percent of respondents who rated the quality of life as "excellent" or "good," or the percent of respondents who attended a public meeting more than once a month. ANOVA and chi-square tests of significance were applied to these comparisons of survey questions. A "p-value" of 0.05 or less indicates that there is less than a 5% probability that differences observed between subgroups are due to chance; or in other words, a greater than 95% probability that the differences observed are "real." Where differences were statistically significant, they have been shaded grey.

The margin of error for this report is generally no greater than plus or minus seven percentage points around any given percent reported for the entire sample (215 completed surveys). For subgroups of responses, the margin of error increases because the sample size for the subgroup is smaller. For subgroups of approximately 100 respondents, the margin of error is plus or minus 10 percentage points.

Notable differences between demographic subgroups included the following:

- Residents that had lived in McAllen for more than 20 years were more likely to rate Community Characteristics higher than residents who had resided in McAllen for less than 20 years. These more positive assessments were found in the facets of Safety, Mobility, Built Environment, Economy, Recreation and Wellness, Education and Enrichment and Community Engagement. Across all facets of Community Characteristics, respondents with annual household incomes of \$49,999 or less were more likely to give higher ratings than those with higher annual household incomes. Generally, older residents (those 55 and older) were more likely to give higher ratings to Community Characteristics than younger residents, and women gave higher ratings than men.
- Within the aspect of Governance, residents who had lived in the community for more than 20 years viewed services related to Safety, Natural Environment, Built Environment, Recreation and Wellness and Education and Enrichment more positively than those who had lived in the community for shorter periods. Women gave higher ratings than men in several aspects of Governance including the overall direction that McAllen is taking, overall confidence in McAllen government, crime prevention, street cleaning, preservation of natural areas, code enforcement and health services.
- Differences were observed within the pillar of Participation. Residents that had lived in McAllen for more than 20 years were more likely to remain in McAllen for the next five years, stock supplies in preparation for an emergency, carpool, make efforts to make their homes more energy efficient and make efforts to conserve water. Respondents that had lived in McAllen for more than 20 years also reported higher levels of Community Engagement than those that had lived in McAllen for shorter periods of time. Residents with annual incomes higher than \$50,000 per year reported higher rates of Community Engagement than those with lower annual household incomes.
