

For the Month Ending June 30, 2024

Comparison with Prior Year

Net income, as reflected on page 3, for the month of June is \$311,915 or a 3.90% increase compared to last year. Toll Revenues for the month were \$478,413 or a 3% increase compared to last year. Expenses were \$220,824 or a 2% increase compared to last year.

Comparison with Budget

Revenues over expenses, as reflected on page 4, for the month of June are \$434,990. Revenues over expenses were \$108,173 better than budget for the month. Total operating revenues were \$501,095 for the month. These total operating revenues were \$79,325 better than budget for the month. June's expenses were \$97,749 or \$6,677 less than budget for the month.

This project received a total of \$2,488,206 in Rider 11B funds, \$8,786,734 in CBI funds, and \$813,266 in Category 7 funds (Metropolitan Mobility Funds), from the Rio Grande Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization. These funds are for Construction. The Local Government is responsible for 100% of Preliminary Engineering, Environmental, and Construction Engineering. Construction costs federal share is 50%, remaining split will be distributed between the state and the Local Government until the federal funding reaches the maximum obligated amount. The Local Government will be responsible for 100% of all cost overruns exceeding the approved funding amount. The following is an estimated breakdown of the project costs and funding participation:

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT (VEHICULAR AND RAIL BRIDGE FEASIBILITY STUDY)

THIS Agreement (hereafter "Interlocal Cooperation Agreement") is made on this the gind day of May, 2017 by and between the Anzalduas International Bridge Board of Trustees ("Anzalduas Bridge Board") and the City of Mission, Texas ("Mission"), pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act, as follows:

WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the City of Mission, City of McAllen and the City of Hidalgo (the "Joint Resolution Parties") entered into a Joint Resolution to utilize the Mission-Reynosa Presidential Permit for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating an international vehicular and rail bridge ("Madero Bridge") on the U.S.-Mexico border, and within the corporate limits of Mission; and

Whereas, the Anzalduas Bridge Board and Mission acknowledge the need for a feasibility study to be completed before construction on the Madero Bridge can commence; and

Whereas, the Anzalduas Bridge Board seeks to facilitate the construction of Madero Bridge and the feasibility study; and

Whereas, the Anzalduas Bridge Board and the Mission desire to enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the payment of S&B Infrastructure, LTD to conduct the preliminary phase of the feasibility study essential to the construction of Madero Bridge.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anzalduas Bridge Board and Mission, in consideration of the mutual covenants expressed hereinafter, agree as follows:

<u>Purpose.</u> This agreement is to provide for the payment of S&B Infrastructure, LTD ("S&B") to execute the preliminary stages of the feasibility study for the construction of Madero Bridge.

<u>Term.</u> This agreement shall be effective April 1, 2017 and shall terminate upon payment of the complete balance owed to S&B for the entirety of the preliminary phase of the feasibility study.

Rights and Obligations.

Anzalduas Bridge Board shall pay to S&B the amounts due for each portion of the preliminary phase of the feasibility study upon receipt of an invoice from S&B that accurately reflects the services rendered and work completed.

Anzalduas Bridge Board shall have the right to end its partnership with Mission for the construction of Madero Bridge and to be relieved of any liability to S&B for any work done-after the exercise of said right. In order to end its partnership, the Anzalduas Bridge Board shall comply with the notice requirements of this Agreement.

Withdrawal from the Madero Bridge project and cessation of liability shall be effective after seven (7) days written notice to Mission.

Should Anzalduas Bridge Board exercise the right to withdraw from the Madero Bridge project, Mission shall be responsible for monies owed to S&B for work done after the effective date of Anzalduas Bridge Board's withdrawal. Furthermore, within thirty (30) days of the Anzalduas Bridge Board's withdrawal, the City of Mission shall reimburse the Anzalduas Bridge Board for all monies paid to S&B for services rendered and work performed, as it relates to the feasibility study only.

Mission and Anzalduas Bridge Board shall mutually agree as to any and all consulting services S&B is to provide and to be paid for under this agreement. All services paid under this agreement shall be under the direction of both parties.

Conflict of Applicable Law. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed so as to require the commission of any act contrary to law, and whenever there is any conflict between any provision of this Agreement and any present of future law, or administrative, executive or judicial regulation, order or decree, or amendment thereof, contrary to which the parties have no legal right to contract, the latter shall prevail, but in such event the affected provision(s) of this Agreement shall be modified only to the extent necessary to bring them within the legal requirements and only during the time such conflict exists.

<u>No Waiver.</u> No waiver by any party hereto of any breach of any provision of the Agreement shall be deemed to be a waiver of any preceding or succeeding breach of the same or any other provision hereof.

<u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement contains the entire contract between the parties hereto and each party acknowledges that neither has made (either directly or through any agent or representative) any representation or agreement in connection with this Agreement not specifically set forth herein. This Agreement may be modified or amended only be agreement in writing executed by both parties, and not otherwise.

<u>TEXAS LAW TO APPLY.</u> THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE CONSTRUED UNDER AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS. THE PARTIES HEREBY CONSENT TO PERSONAL JURISDICTION IN HIDALGO COUNTY, TEXAS.
