SUBJECT: **APPEAL DECISION** OF THE **PLANNIG** AND ZONING THE

COMMISSION OF THE APRIL 16, 2013 MEETING DENYING THE REQUEST OF MARK GILL FOR A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT, FOR ONE YEAR, FOR A NAIL SALON AND BAR AT LOT A, RIDGE

CROSSING #2 SUBDIVISION: 2000 SOUTH MCCOLL ROAD, UNIT L.

GOAL:

A Conditional Use Permit is to allow the compatible and orderly development, within the city, of uses which may be suitable only in certain locations in a zoning district if developed in a 1) specific way or, 2) only for a limited period of time, 3) is required for all conditional uses as set forth in the conditional use paragraph of each district, and 4) at no time may a structure or property be adapted to a conditional use without first obtaining a conditional use permit.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

The property is located on the west side of South McColl Road, approximately 540 ft. south of East Ridge Road, and is zoned C-3 (general business) District. The adjacent zoning is C-3 District to the north, east and south and C-1 (office building) District to the west. Surrounding land uses include commercial businesses, offices, restaurants, and multi-family residences. A bar is allowed in a C-3 zone with a Conditional Use Permit and in compliance with requirements.

Currently, there is a 14,329 sq. ft. multi-tenant commercial building on the property. The only tenant in the building at the moment is Sendero Community Church, which utilizes 5,182 sq. ft. of floor area. The applicant is proposing to utilize Unit L, approximately 1,801 sq. ft. of lease space, for a nail salon with alcohol being served for its customers; therefore, a conditional use permit is required. The hours of operation will be from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Monday thru Saturday. Based on the square footage for the nail salon, 8 parking spaces are required; 120 parking spaces are provided on site as part of the common parking area for the development. There is a party center being proposed in the same commercial building for which the conditional use permit is also on this agenda. The party center will be utilizing 3,487 sq. ft. of lease space and will require 35 parking spaces. The church requires 25 parking spaces for a total of 68 parking spaces required for the threes uses, leaving 52 spaces available. Approximately 3,859 sq. ft. of building area is still not used and is available for rent.

The Health and Fire Departments have inspected the establishment; however, a final

inspection is still pending once the work is complete. Should the conditional use permit be approved, the applicant would be required to sign the application acknowledging and agreeing to the conditions of the permit. The establishment must also meet the requirements set forth in Section 138-118(4) of the Zoning Ordinance and specific requirements as follows:

- 1) The property line of the lot of any of the abovementioned businesses must be at least 600 ft. from the nearest residence or residentially zoned property, church, school, or publicly owned property, and must be designed to prevent disruption of the character of adjacent residential areas, and must not be heard from the residential area after 10:00 p.m. The proposed establishment is within 600 ft. from residential zones/uses:
- 2) The property must be as close as possible to a major arterial and shall not generate traffic onto residential sized streets. The establishment is located on South McColl Road and does not generate traffic into residential areas;
- The business must provide parking in accordance with the McAllen Off-Street Parking Ordinance as a minimum, and make provisions to prevent the use of adjacent streets for parking. Based on the square footage for the nail salon, 8 parking spaces are required; 120 parking spaces are provided on site as part of the common parking area for the development. There is a party center being proposed in the same commercial building for which the conditional use permit is also on this agenda. The party center will be utilizing 3,487 sq. ft. of lease space and will require 35 parking spaces. The church requires 25 parking spaces for a total of 68 parking spaces required for the three uses, leaving 52 spaces available;
- 4) The business must do everything possible to prevent the unauthorized parking of its patrons on adjacent properties;
- 5) The business shall provide sufficient lighting to eliminate dark areas and maximize visibility from a public street in order to discourage vandalism and criminal activities;
- 6) The business must make provisions to keep litter to a minimum and keep it from blowing onto adjacent properties; and
- 7) The above mentioned business shall restrict the number of persons within the building to those allowed by the Planning and Zoning Commission at the time of permit issuance, after having taken into account the recommendations of the Fire Marshal, Building Official and Planning Director. The maximum number of persons allowed will be determined at time of building permit.

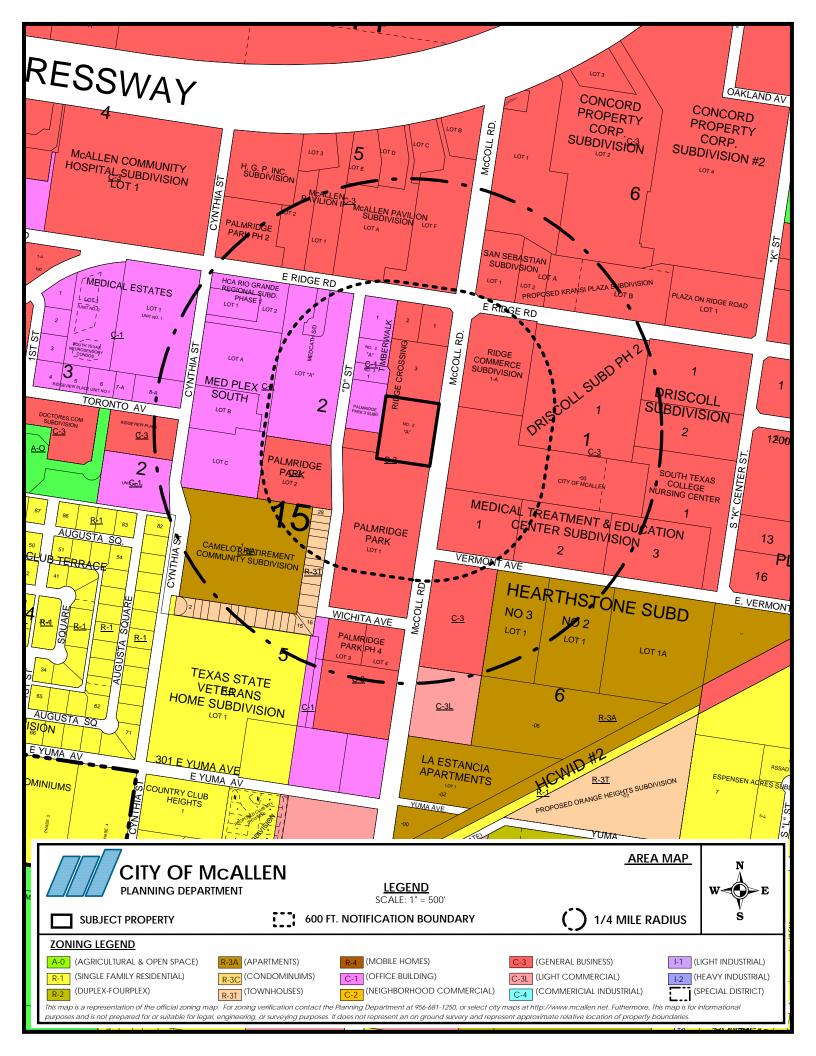

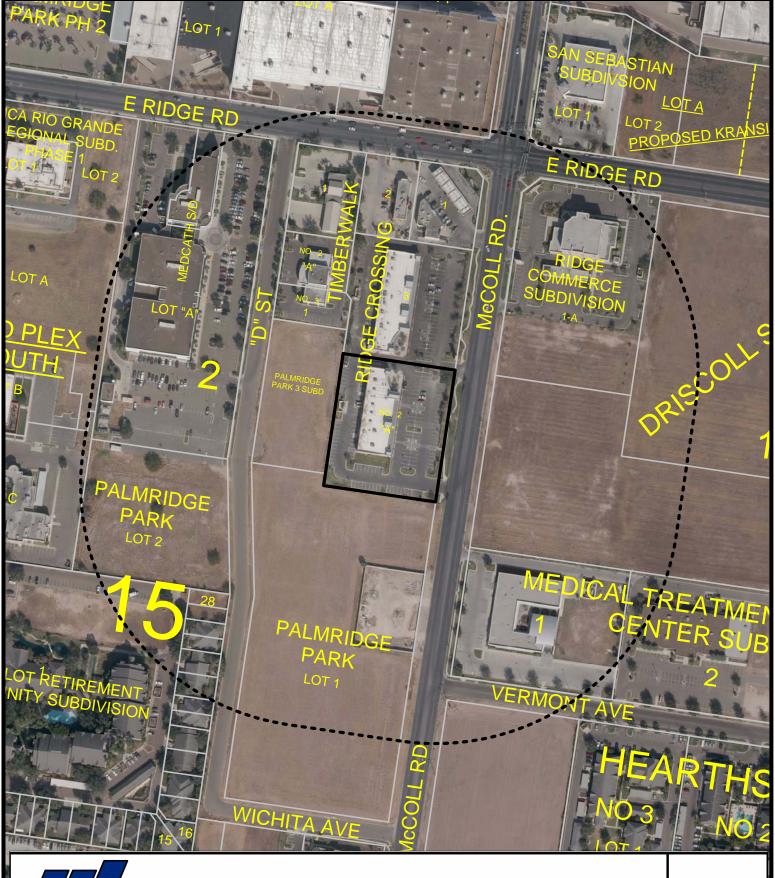
RECOMMENDATION:

The request was heard at the April 16, 2013 Planning and Zoning Commission meeting. There was no one present in opposition of the request. The applicant, Mark Gill and his representative, Steve Spoor were present.

The board inquired information about the proposed nail salon and the bar. They asked if the alcohol was going to be given away for free or sold to either their customers or the public. Mr. Mark Gill, the applicant, stated that the alcohol will be sold and be only available to their customers.

Following discussion, the board unanimously voted to disapprove the request due to noncompliance with requirement #1 (distance) of Section 138-118(4) of the Zoning Ordinance, but with a favorable recommendation for a variance to be granted to the distance requirement. There were six members present and voting. The applicant has submitted a letter of appeal.

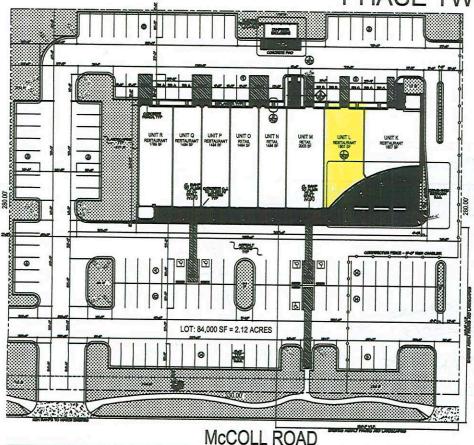

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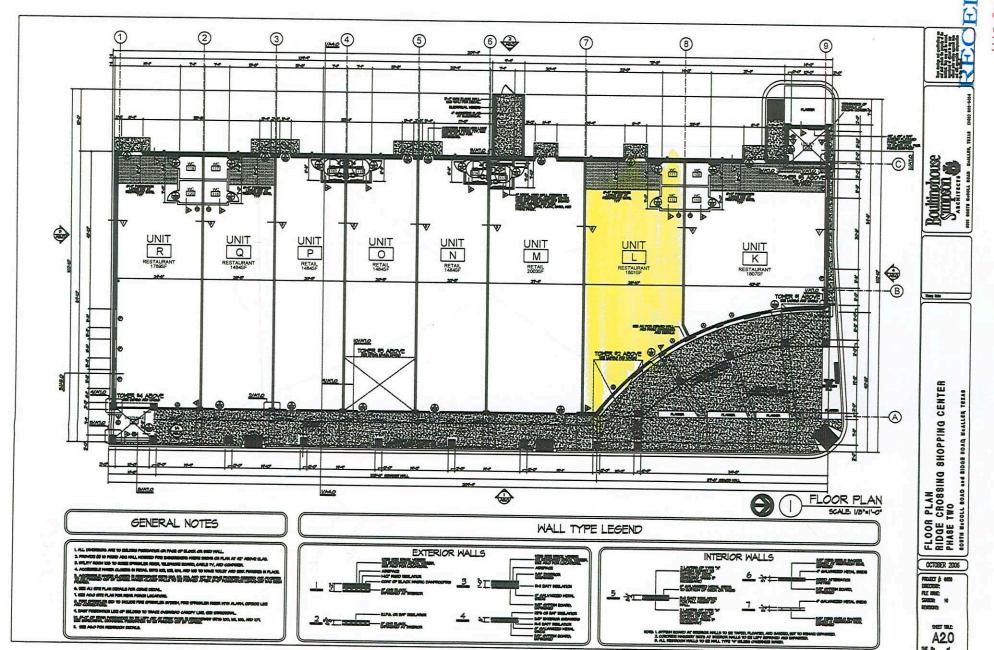
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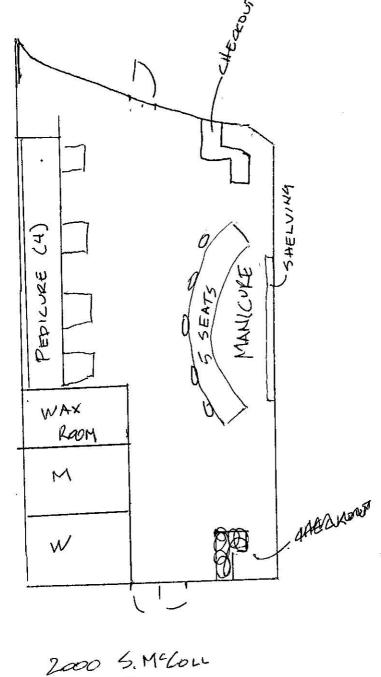

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CODE AT LOT A, RIDGE CROSSING #2 SUBDIVISION;

2000 SOUTH MCCOLL ROAD, SUITE L.

GOAL: To encourage commercial development or redevelopment that protects the character of surrounding areas.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

The property is located on the west side of S. McColl Road, approximately 540 ft. south of E. Ridge Road and is zoned C-3 (general business) District. Surrounding land uses include commercial businesses, restaurants, offices, and Sendero Community Church which is located within the same commercial plaza.

The applicant, Mr. Mark Gill, is requesting a variance to the distance requirement from a place of business with alcohol sales that is within 300 ft. of any church, public or private school, or public hospital. Mr. Gill is proposing to operate a nail salon (Nails Lounge & Gifts) with alcohol being served for its customers. Therefore, a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for a bar is required and is also on the same agenda for consideration of the CUP. The proposed days and hours of operation are from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday thru Saturday.

Based on Chapter 6 of the City of McAllen's Alcoholic Beverage Code (which is substantially the same as the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code), no beer or other alcoholic beverage shall be sold within the city by any dealer where the place of business of such dealer is within 300 ft. of any church, public or private school or public hospital. The measurements are from property line to property line as provided in the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code, § 109.33. The property line of the lot is within 300 ft. of Sendero Community Church. Further, the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) treats any operation that sells wine, beer or alcohol as a "dealer".

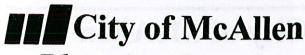

Sons Equipment of La Grange, TX for a pre-owned 2012 McCloskey 621RE Trommel Screen for a base unit cost of \$237,750.00. Award also included Optional Equipment bid items 4, 5, 6, and 7 for an added cost that had been requested for \$30,725.00. However, added c osts instead should represent a t otal of \$27,725.00 for a t otal aggregate price of \$265,475.00. Due to the fact that Base Bid Item #5, Vacuum – Wind Sifter was added at a cost of \$24,350.00, instead of \$21,350.00, a Change Order for a decrease in price is being requested.

Purchase Order #00019107 was created and subsequently submitted to McCourt & Sons Equipment, Inc. On April 2, 2013, a Pre-Owned 2012 McCloskey 621RE Trommel Screen at a unit price of \$237,750.00, a Wind Break Attachment at a price of \$2,625.00 and a Reversible Fan at a price of \$3,750.00 were ordered. However, due to the price decrease and request for a change order, we are still pending ordering the Vacuum Wind Sifter at a price of \$21,350.00 to complete the purchase order contract awarded. Public Works is seeking authorization for a change order to reflect the decrease in price when the final invoice is received.

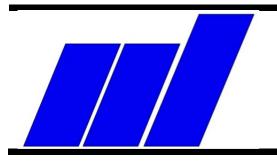

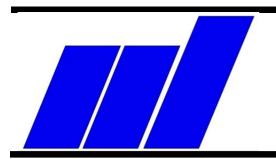

GOAL: Authorize the submission of a grant application on behalf of the Police Department to the Texas School Safety Center on behalf of the Department of State Health Services for funding under the FY 2014 Tobacco Enforcement Program.

BRIEF EXPLANATION OF THE ITEM:

The Tobacco Enforcement Program provides funding to support activities to reduce the extent of tobacco to which cigarettes and tobacco products are illegally sold or distributed to person who are younger than 18 years of age. The amount of funds awarded to jurisdictions is determined by the Texas School Safety Center based on the amount of overall applications received, the jurisdictional retail outlet density, and meeting DSHS' distribution goal for statewide coverage per Health and Human Services Region. Historically, award amounts have averaged \$5,000. There is no local match required for awarded funds.

OPTIONS:

Option 1: Approving the submission of the grant application will allow the McAllen Police Department to conduct activities that will reduce the rate of underage usage of tobacco and enforce compliance laws among tobacco retailers.

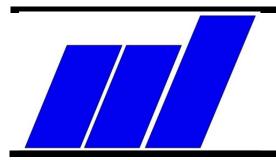

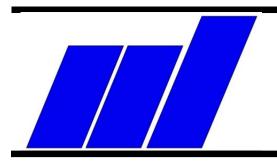

GOAL:

The goal of residential developments is to 1) safeguard the character of neighborhoods and improve the quality of life for their residents, and 2) encourage the development of transportation facilities that efficiently move people and goods.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

This lot is located on the west side of Augusta Square St. It has approximately 72.36 feet of frontage on Augusta Square and a depth of 120 feet. It's zoned R-1 (single family residential) District. Adjacent zoning is R-1 in all directions, with surrounding land uses of single family homes.

The lot is vacant and was subdivided in 1978. It was split by metes and bounds in 2005, and the current owner acquired the property in 2012. She wishes to build a 4,040.07 sq. ft. home on site. Single family homes exist on the abutting lots.

Mr. Gerardo Gomez (owner's son), is requesting a variance from the City codes which require land to be properly subdivided prior to issuing a building permit. If a variance is granted, Ms. Gomez would obtain building and related permits from the City of McAllen. The project involves construction of stormwater improvements to include installation of new inlets and culverts, two new dry detention ponds, roadway, curbing, sidewalks and a stormwater pump station with a force main discharge main to serve an area not previously provided with a positive drainage system. The drainage improvements will include the entire area of the existing Retiree Haven subdivision. The drainage force main outfall will run along S. 10th Street and outfall into the floodway pilot channel. The project will also include the extension of a 10-inch water line from the Retiree Haven subdivision to the south side of the floodway, a distance of approximately 3,672 linear feet.

Goal:

Consideration and approval of the reimbursement contract to allow T5, Inc. and TAVAMASO, Inc. to participate with the drainage improvements associated with the Retiree Haven Paving and Drainage Improvements

Explanation:

The City of McAllen was awarded a FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant that proposes to construct drainage improvements within the limits of the Retiree Haven Subdivision. The improvements includes a drainage system that outfalls into two detention areas within the subdivision. These detention areas are drained with a lift station that outfalls through a 16 inch force main into the IBWC floodway.

Representatives from T5, Inc. and TAVAMASO, Inc. requested to participate with the outfall improvements if they could be oversized to include runoff from their tracts of land, located to the west of Retiree Haven Subdivision. However, due to the design of the lift station, it was not practical to upsize the outfall. Instead, the Consulting Engineers have provided a design that includes a parallel 16 inch force main that can be extended to service the tracts to the west of Retiree Haven.

T5 Inc. and TAVAMASO, Inc. have both indicated that they desire to participate with the costs necessary to install the parallel 16 inch force main. Those costs are identified as Alternate #4 in the bid documents, in the amount of \$52,700.00. However, there was a recent request to extend the line an additional 140 ft for a total cost of \$59,700.00. If the final quantity differs from this amount, the Developers will be assessed at the unit cost for the installed quantity.

Options:

- 1. Approve the reimbursement contract.
- 2. Disapprove the reimbursement contract.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of the reimbursement contract with T5 Inc. and TAVAMASO, Inc. for participation with improvements associated with Retiree Haven Subdivision Paving and Drainage Improvements.
