McALLEN PROPERTY TAX INCENTIVES BREAKDOWN TO PROMOTE HISTORIC PRESERVATION *

City Landmark Properties – Ad valorem tax exemption in perpetuity equal to <u>fifty</u> <u>percent (50%) of the assessed value</u> of the qualified building and/or structure and land. *McAllen Code of Ordinances, Sec.* 98-69(a)(1).

City Landmark Properties with Federal or State Designation – Ad valorem tax exemption in perpetuity equal to <u>one hundred percent (100%) of the assessed value</u> of the qualified building and/or structure and land. *Ord. Sec.* 98-69(a)(4).

Heritage Property – Ad valorem tax exemption for 10 years equal to <u>one hundred</u> <u>percent (100%) of any increase in the assessed value</u> of the qualified building and land at the time the designation was filed, if voluntary, or at the time the property was designated, if involuntary. *Ord. Sec.* 98-69(a)(2).

Properties in a Historic District – Except for buildings less than 50 years old that are not designated heritage properties, properties qualify for an ad valorem tax exemption for 5 years equal to <u>one hundred percent (100%) of any increase in the assessed value</u> of the qualified building and/or structure and land at the time the designation application was filed, if voluntary, or at the time the property was designated, if involuntary. *Ord. Sec.* 98-69(a)(3); *Ord. Sec.* 138-413(a)(5).

*Property owner must apply for tax incentives each year. *McAllen Code of Ordinances, Sec.* 98-70.

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
